**ORDER:**

The Pay Revision Commissioner, 1986 while making his recommendations on the Automatic Advancement Scheme among other things has recommended to treat the intermediary posts abolished, as existing the purpose of Automatic Advancement Scheme. Accordingly orders were issued in the Govt. order first read above

2. In the reference 2nd read above, the Director Printing, Stationery & Stores Purchase Department has brought to the notice of the Govt., the instances where the corresponding scale of the abolished posts is equal to the revised pay Scale of the feeder categories of such abolished posts. It is resulting in the employees who are getting a higher scale in the special grade getting a lesser scale on their appointment to the Special promotion post for the reason that no Revised Pay Scale has been assigned to the abolished categories whereas that feeder categories have enjoyed an upward revision in 1986 Pay Revision.

3. After careful consideration, Govt. hereby order that the categories which have been abolished prior to 1-7-86 may be ignored for purpose of appointment to the Automatic Advancement Grades and the Revised Pay Scale of actual promotion category be assigned as Special Promotion Post Scale-1/Special Promotion post Scale-11 as the case may be however, the posts which are abolished after 1-7- 86, be treated as existing for purpose of appointment to the Automatic Advancement Grades. The Orders issued in the Govt. order 1st read above shall b(r) deemed to have been amended to this effect.
