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ORDER:

Retired Government Employees in me State are entitled to free medical attention in all Government institutions. These facilities are spelt out in the. G.Os. referred to above. Many pensioners are either not aware of these orders or there is lack of proper appreciation of me facilities they are entitled to. In Andhra Pradesh there are at present Teaching Hospitals, 19 Specialist Hospitals, 18 District Headquarters Hospitals. 180 Taluk Head-quarters Hospitals, 420 Primary Health Centers and 653 Rural dispensaries at which the pensioners can avail of the attention they require.

2. Under role 6(i) of the Andhra Pradesh Integrated Medical Attendance Rules, 1972 the retired and re-employed pensioners (both Gazetted and Non-Gazetted) are entitled to free medical treatment in all the Government Hospitals listed above. All State Government pensioners including pensioners of All India Service and their families as defined under Rule 3(7) of Andhra Pradesh Integrated Medical Attendance Rules, 1972 are eligible for the following medical facilities as are applicable to the Government servants.

(A). Free Accommodation in the hospitals as per eligibility indicated below: -

(a) Pensioners who retired before 1-1-1974, shall be eligible for hospital accommodation based OR &e pay last drawn by them before retirement, as under column (1) of the above statement.

(b) Pensioner who retired after 1-1-1974 and before 1-4-1978 shall be eligible for hospital accommodation as under Column (2) of the above statement

(c) Pensioners who retired after 1-4-1978 shall be eligible for hospital accommodation as per Column (4) of the statement.

- (B) Free supply of medicines available in die hospitals
- (C) Free supply of diet as per rules.
- (D) Free Medical advice and treatment including operations.

3. The pensioners shall have to produce their identity certificate from the concerned pension disbursing Officers or. some other identity card they may be prescribed, while seeking treatment at Government Hospitals. For this purpose, the pensioners, and their families should get themselves registered at any Government Hospital of their choice where they wish to be attended normally. But this would not prevent them from getting medical attention and treatment from any other hospital in the State, i.e., other than the one at which they stand registered.

4. The pensioners shall not be eligible to claim reimbursement of medical expenses and for medicines purchased in the open market, if any, on the prescriptions even of the Government Medical Officers, But the medicines which are not available in the hospitals shall be purchased by the concerned Medical Officers in charge of Hospitals and

dispensaries and supplied to the pensioners and their families, as per orders issued in the G.O. sixth cited. The total amount thus incurred in this regard shall be consolidated once in a quarter and after approval by the Director of Medical and Health Services, shall be reported to the Government in Finance Department who will provide the

same to the Medical Department over and above the budget provision. The provision for purchase of medicines for pensioners and their families will be made over and above the normal Departmental budget provision for purchase of drugs etc.

5. Whenever pensioners and their families are admitted in the Government Hospitals they shall be provided with accommodation on the basis of pay last drawn by the retire Government servants before their retirement as per Para 2(A) above. When they are not able to get accommodation to which they are entitled, they can to given higher

category of accommodation by collecting the difference of charges livable for that higher category and the category to which they are eligible.

6. The pensioners and their families shall not be eligible for admission into the wards reserved under the "Three Tier System" of treatment in Osmania General Hospital, Hyderabad and other district Head Quarters Hospital, etc., introduced in G.O.Ms.No. 431, M&H, Dt. 5-7-1978 and G.O.Ms.No. 728 M&H, Dt: 19-6-1980.

7. All Heads of Medical Institutions should follow the above orders scrupulously in regard to State Government pensioners and their families.

8. This order issues with the concurrence of Finance and Planning Department vide their U.O.No. 1222/S(W)/F&P, Dt: 29-12-1980.
